Horticulture

- Each exhibitor is allowed a maximum of 8 entries with no more than one per cultivar (variety).
- All horticulture specimens must be fresh plant material grown by the exhibitor.
- All horticulture specimens must be identified by its binomial name or currently accepted scientific identification. Common name may also be given in addition to the scientific name.
- Containers for container grown plants may not exceed 12" at the widest point of diameter. Double potting is allowed.
- Cut specimens must be exhibited in clean, clear glass bottles (no lettering), in size appropriate to the specimen, supplied by exhibitor. No plastic containers will be accepted.
- Cut specimens should not have any foliage below the water line.
- Entries of cut specimens may be staged with a small amount of clear plastic wrap or bubble wrap furnished by the exhibitor for inconspicuous wedging in the neck of the bottle to assure that the specimen stands straight.
- Cut specimens may not exceed 30" from cut end of stem to tip of specimen and must have several nodes and an apical tip.
- Only one specimen per container except where otherwise specified.
